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COURSE OVERVIEW

The Traffic Control Training programs provide instructions on and training for individuals required to control traffic with a Stop/Slow bat and those required to set up and work with Traffic Control Guidance Schemes/Traffic Control Plans at a work site.

Two programs can be run independently or together depending on our clients' requirements. We provide training for both Traffic Controllers and Implement Traffic Control Plans. All our training is provided for New Entrants to the market and Exisiting Workers who may need to formalise skills or recertify.

Finishers of the 3-day training course can commence work after obtaining a Statement of Completion (SOC) from SafeWork NSW which is valid for 90 days. Within those 90 days, a final assessment of a live project needs to be arranged. Once complete, individuals will be issued with a Statement of Attainment and obtain their Photocard from SafeWork NSW.

DURATION & STRUCTURE

2-Day Theory & Simulation Course + 1-Day Practical Live Assessment

From 09:00 to 17:00

Classes for each day are from 09:00 to 17:00 and comprise class-based theory and simulation. The practical live assessment is arranged after the two-day course and is a requirement for all learners to complete the course and obtain their competency cards.

Each course has final assessment outcomes required within 90 days of the initial training. Graduates should find employment so live assessment can take place.

COURSE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Learners must present **100 Points of Identification** (physical documents) on the day of their enrolment.
- There are no formal entry requirements or prerequisites for the course, but we expect you to have a genuine interest and a desire to work in traffic management. The work required can also be physically demanding so you must consider your physical wellbeing and capacity.
- Prospective learners will be required to attain an adequate level of competency in basic Language, Literacy and Numeracy skills before they can commence the training. The liability on the learner, other team members and members of the public in terms of safety, is critical. Participants should communicate effectively and confidently in English and interpret safety signs and symbols.
- Learners must wear comfortable sensible clothing for this form of training. You will be conducting practical components so you need to wear enclosed footwear at all times, preferably safety boots with steel caps, as well as durable long pants or jeans.

COURSE ELEMENTS

MAIN OBJECTIVES

At the end of the course, the learner should be able to:

- Stop/direct road users and understand stopping sight distances, using a stop/slow bat.
- Understand the Traffic Control Guidance Schemes (TCGS) also known as Traffic Control Plans.
- Assess and respond to changes in the environment e.g. traffic volumes, weather conditions, road conditions, Work Health and Safety (WHS).
- Use communication methods and devices that include verbal and nonverbal.
- Select a TCGS/TCP to suit site conditions, the specific road environment, traffic volumes and work activities.
- Plan for emergencies that may arise.
- Install and remove signs and traffic control devices, lane closures, and advanced information signage in line with a TCGS/TCP.

After completing this course:
